# **Fire Sector Congress**

The Federation is leading the initiative to develop a Fire Sector Congress as a single coherent body to help shape fire safety policy in the UK. The plans were explained to members at the recent AGM. Facilitated by the Federation, the Congress would comprise people representative of the sectors that are involved in fire safety, including government and regulators.

The agenda would be driven by the priorities identified by the Federation's professional thematic domains workstreams feeding through to the National Fire Safety Strategy Board.

As plans for the establishment of the Congress have evolved, the Federation has been engaging extensively to gauge support for the initiative. Pleasingly, the plans have been met with overwhelming support across the sectors' main professional bodies as well as the key departments of state and nondepartmental public bodies, who have now agreed to participate. The focus of development work, therefore, has now moved to implementing the practical arrangements required to deliver the Congress in a meaningful way over the coming months.

# **Sprinkler Regulations**



The National Fire Chiefs Council has published a position statement urging Government to introduce more robust regulations for

mandating sprinklers and other automatic water suppression systems in England. NFCC is calling for a requirement that sprinklers are installed in all new care homes, schools, and student accommodation, irrespective of building height. More information is available here.

## **Scottish Cladding Bill**

The Scottish Parliament has passed a bill that aims to tackle unsafe cladding on buildings. The Housing Cladding Remediation Bill was passed unanimously and will give ministers the power to assess and carry out remediation on buildings with unsafe cladding, with any work recorded in a special register.
